


OUR MISSION

- Reducing call center and office wait times for citizens, resulting in cost savings to federal agencies and taxpayers.






SERVING CITIZENS IN NEED

Benefits.gov helps citizens find benefits and resources relevant to their life circumstances.


- 1,100+ Programs, 16 Categories

Citizens are encouraged to take our Benefit Finder questionnaire to find benefits they may be eligible for.



- The Benefit Finder is free, confidential, and will not ask for personally identifiable information.
- Citizens answer a series of questions about their situation and receive a list of benefits tailored to their needs across all assistance categories.
- Citizens can email or print details for later use and find application information for each benefit.
